


A YEAR IN LOCKDOWN

On 16 March 2020 the Coliseum closed its doors to help slow the spread of Coronavirus. We finally reopened over 15 months later.

Creating and experiencing art and culture has a phenomenal impact on both physical and mental wellbeing. Whilst our stage was dark, our work was always needed. The Coliseum continued to serve our community, reaching out and engaging with participants of all ages and producing and sharing great art and opportunities to be creative. Below is just a snapshot of what we've achieved behind closed doors:

Whodunnit at the Coliseum?: We co-produced our very own online murder mystery. The interactive experience was part theatre, part film, part video game.

Micro-commissions: Exploring health and wellbeing, local stories or work for and with young people from Oldham, we commissioned seven artists to create a range of work to be experienced digitally, which are available via our website.

Online Workshops: Our flagship training programme for young people, Pathways, our script writing group Scribbles and our Youth Steering Group all went online.

Festive Digital Offers: We produced a package of digital offers for the Festive season, which were viewed over 30,000 times. Our Advent Plays are still available on our YouTube channel.

Stitch and Stamp: We distributed over 200 craft packs for people in our communities based on the themes of Positivity and Connection.



Poetry Health Service: From Coliseum Associate Artist Hafsa Aneela Bashir, the Poetry Health Service (PHS) is a free online service which champions the importance of art to support mental and emotional wellbeing. www.poetryhealthservice.com

#ColiseumCreates: We produced a package of fun activities for families, available via our website.

GM Artist Hub: Arts organisations across Greater Manchester came together to offer our support to over 300 freelance artists from across our region. The GM Artist Hub offers free advisory sessions, workshops and funding opportunities. www.gm-artisthub.co.uk

Streaming: We live streamed a gig featuring songs from previous Coliseum shows to over 400 people and 12,500 people watched our 2019 co-production of *The Hired Man*.

Participants: We made regular phone calls to participants who are at risk of experiencing loneliness and isolation due to the lockdown.

Mini-Podcast Series: We produced a Mini-Podcast Series sharing over 20 new audio-plays. The series is available on all the usual streaming platforms and via our website.

Welcome to our Autumn-Winter 2021-2022 season

Firstly, I want to pass on my huge, heartfelt thanks for all the support you've shown the Coliseum over the last 16 months. When we closed our doors to the public on 16 March 2020 I had no idea that we would be closed for so long and just how challenging the period to come would be. To everyone who has made a donation to the theatre, supported our #GetBehindUs Crowdfunder campaign, chosen to receive a refund to credit to be used for a future booking, enjoyed our digital offers and sent us messages of support, thank you. It has meant the world to us. The theatre industry as a whole is by no means out of the woods yet, so do please continue to support us all where you can.

I'm so pleased to be introducing you to our first full season in almost two years. Some shows are new, some are rescheduled shows that were originally due to take place in 2020, like our much-loved annual pantomime *Aladdin*, which we cannot wait to finally share with you now it's been two years in the making. Christmas last year didn't feel the same without pantomime.

Our Season Ticket includes *Love n Stuff*, a laugh-out-loud comedy about love, marriage and the family you choose; *Who Cares?*, a gritty portrayal of young carers taken from real-life testimonies; new John Godber comedy *Sunny Side Up*, a hilariously topical exploration of British 'staycations', a new adaptation of the classic American gothic story *The Legend of Sleepy Hollow*; *My Voice Was Heard But It Was Ignored*, an urgent interrogation of racial identity; one of my all time favourite plays *Blue/Orange*, which I've chosen to do now because its themes of racism, mental health and the ethics of those in power feel particularly relevant; *The Glee Club*, a raucous comedy with live music based on a group of singing miners and *The Ballad of Maria Marten*, a thrilling re-telling of a real-life murder mystery.

We understand that some people may be hesitant to return to live performances and we can assure you that your safety is of the utmost importance to us. We are continuing to offer socially distanced performances where possible and details of our updated safety measures can be found on the back page of this brochure, and on our website.

Finally, we'd like to reiterate that you can book with us with confidence. We've updated our terms and conditions of sale (see our website for more details), so that if you cannot attend due to a Covid-related reason, you can receive a full refund.

Take a look through these pages and I hope you find something of interest to you. I absolutely cannot wait to welcome you back to the Coliseum again.



GET INVOLVED

The Coliseum's Learning and Engagement programme provides accessible ways for individuals and groups to get involved in watching and making theatre, whilst using creative practice as a tool for community development.

We co-develop and deliver inspiring artistic collaborations that stretch the imaginations and skills of groups in Oldham and across Greater Manchester.

The kettle's on, get in touch if you have an idea for a creative project and we can work with you to bring it to life.

EDUCATION & TRAINING

Our **Curriculum Enrichment Programme** provides primary schools with cross curricular, creative approaches to engaging children in a range of topics, whilst augmenting the work of the classroom teacher.

Our **Story Boxes** have been specially made by designer Irene Jade. Arriving to your classroom in style on wheels, these boxes are packed full of stimulating resources to explore the pantomime genre or *James and the Giant Peach* by Roald Dahl with your class.

Run in conjunction with North West Drama Services Ltd, the **Children's Shakespeare Festival** is an inter-school performance that takes place on the Coliseum's Main Stage, enabling children to develop a deep understanding of Shakespeare's plays through compelling classroom drama.

The **Secondary Education Partnership Scheme** aims to develop long term, meaningful links with students through their schools, who take part in a programme of theatre visits, masterclasses and talks. Each year, partner schools collaborate to perform a piece of theatre on the Main Stage.

YOUNG PEOPLE

Pathways: Theatre Makers provides young people aged **13 - 18 years** with opportunities to experience theatre making from a variety of perspectives, for example, exploring the process of a writer, producer or designer. Young people will work collectively to produce project pieces and plays in a multi-disciplinary way.

Pathways: Teaching Theatre is the Coliseum's flagship training programme for young people not in education, employment or training. Participants work alongside industry professionals from a range of areas to learn new skills in a professional environment before putting their skills into practice through a range of creative briefs.

Pathways: Platforms is a project-based group for young people aged **18+** to develop their skills and experiences of producing their own work. Led by the interests of the group, participants are supported in designing and leading their own creative projects with industry support.

Pathways: Network is a personal and professional skills development network for young people aged **18-30**, to share and develop their creative ideas and gain industry knowledge.

COMMUNITY

If you're a Greater Manchester based group, sign up for **Coliseum Community: Partnership Scheme**, a free, specially tailored programme to create a piece of theatre for the Coliseum's Main Stage in collaboration with up to six other groups.

Our **Coliseum Community: Co-Creates** strand encourages action research and new developmental projects, led by Oldham's communities.

FAMILIES

We deliver activities for children and families in partnership with a range of providers across Greater Manchester, including family friendly theatre tours. Throughout Covid-19 we have also developed a range of free online resources for families. Visit the website to find out more.

ADULTS

In partnership with Ludovico Studios, we'll be running **acting classes for adults** this Autumn. Sign up for updates by emailing LED@coliseum.org.uk.

Full Circle is a friendly and welcoming group for anyone over 50 who's interested in trying new things and meeting new people. Full Circle meet on a fortnightly basis during term time for talks and activities relating to theatre, the arts and the local area.

Established in 2019 as part of the Local Lives project, **Theatre Club** offers a welcoming space for single adults who love theatre. If you'd like to attend a production and discuss a show with other theatre-goers, then get in touch. You'll receive discounted tickets and drinks and access to exclusive talks and events.

A programme of training and development for adults from minority ethnic backgrounds, **Roots to Routes** offers support, mentorship and training opportunities for people who wish to enter into the performing arts industry, enhance their skills and grow their networks.

Connor cares for his mum. But he doesn't like to talk about it.







How to find us

Find the Coliseum on Fairbottom Street, off Yorkshire Street in Oldham Town Centre

By tram

Oldham is served by Metrolink. The stops at Oldham Central (six minutes' walk) and Oldham Mumps (four minutes' walk) offer easy access to the Coliseum. www.metrolink.co.uk

By bus

The Coliseum is a 10 minute walk from Oldham Bus Station and the nearest bus stop is on Yorkshire Street. Transport services are available for people with accessibility needs: Ring and Ride and Local Link. For help planning your journey visit www.tfgm.co.uk

By car

Oldham town centre is easily accessible by road, close to M62 (junction 20, then follow the A627(M) to Oldham) and M60 (junction 22 and follow Manchester Road to Oldham). Fairbottom Street is located off Yorkshire Street, accessible via St. Mary's Way and Union Street via Oldham Way.

Parking

The main car park on Bradshaw Street is just 100 yards away. It costs £1.50 from 6pm and is free on Saturdays and Sundays for up to three hours. A valid ticket must be displayed at all times. The car park postcode is OL1 3EX. Season Ticket holders and Our Coliseum members can park for free from 6pm. The car park is operated by Oldham Council and their rules apply.

Access at the Coliseum

- A limited number of Blue Badge parking spaces are available on Fairbottom Street
- A free companion ticket is available for disabled customers if required
- We have an accessible shop, bar and adapted toilets on site
