

Black Men Walking

Inspired by a real-life walking men's group in Sheffield, ***Black Men Walking*** comes to Oldham Coliseum Theatre this October.

Black Men Walking tells the compelling story of three middle-aged Black men: Thomas, Matthew and Richard, who meet every month as part of a walking group to explore the dramatic landscape of the Peak District in Yorkshire. On this particular trip, the rest of group cancels and it soon feels like maybe they should have done too. The men find themselves forced to walk backwards through two thousand years of Black history, embarking on a dangerous journey that invokes an element of the supernatural, an encounter with the spirits of their ancestors and an exploration of what it means to be both Black and British today.

The Sheffield-based walking group which inspired the production was founded in 2004 by a group of men of African and African-Caribbean heritage who started walking for health, wellbeing and camaraderie.

The first work staged as part of the Eclipse's ground-breaking 'Revolution Mix' movement, which is delivering the largest ever national programme of Black British stories produced and performed in UK theatres, ***Black Men Walking*** premiered at the Royal Exchange Theatre, Manchester in January 2018. Nominated for UK Theatre's Best New Play Award and The Writer's Guild's Best Play Award, the original production was conceived by Eclipse Theatre in collaboration with Leeds-based rapper **Testament** and directed by **Dawn Walton**. The play won rave reviews for its exploration of complex themes including race and identity, expressed through dramatic story telling which mixes prose, poetry and original music.

Testament is a rapper, beatboxer and theatre maker currently based in West Yorkshire. He is Ch4 Playwright in Residence at The Royal Exchange Theatre, Manchester.

Credits include performances on BBC, MTV, BBC Radio 1 and BBC 1xtra, radio 3, 4, 5 & 6. He also holds the Guinness World Record for leading the world's largest Human Beatbox ensemble. Testament won the BBC Urban Music Talent Award in 2007 and has since worked with a diverse range of artists from Corinne Bailey Rae and Soweto Kinch to US legend, DJ KoolHerc.

Testament (aka Andy Brooks) is passionate pushing further into his journey as a playwright. He has gone from using his voice to confront issues as an underground hip-hop artist, transitioning to a one man theatre performer and is now finding his voice as a new and exciting playwright with things to say about the world and how we treat one another.

Dawn Walton has more than twenty years' experience as a professional Theatre Director. She has directed more than twenty full productions for (amongst others) Sheffield Theatres, Royal Court Theatre, Young Vic, Sadlers Wells, RSC and five national middle-scale tours (four produced with Eclipse). Previous productions have received nominations for Olivier awards and at the TMA Awards. From 2009 – 2019, Dawn was artistic director of Eclipse Theatre, the UK's foremost Black-led production company. Whilst at helm of the company, Dawn was instrumental in the creating and driving two major movements, '**Revolution Mix**' – which is delivering the largest ever national delivery of new Black British productions in theatre, film and radio and '**Slate: Black. Arts. World**', supporting Black artists in the North.
